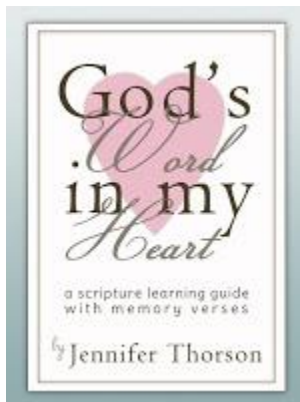
12 POWERFUL Proverbs TO TEACH YOUR CHILDREN
